Somerset County, on Maryland's Eastern Shore, is the state's southernmost county. The Chesapeake Bay forms its western boundary, Virginia its southern. It is located approximately 100 miles from the Baltimore/Washington, Wilmington/ Philadelphia, and Norfolk/Hampton Roads metropolitan areas.

Crisfield and Princess Anne are the major business and industrial centers of the county. Somerset's 450 businesses employ 4,130 workers, with approximately nine of these employing over 100. Major

employers are Sysco Eastern Maryland, Handy International, Mountaire Farms, PNC, Perdue, Rubberset, Eastern Correctional Institute and the University of Maryland Eastern Shore. Somerset is a major seafood processor and poultry producer, and provides a rich agricultural harvest. Princess Anne is the county seat and the site of the University of Maryland Eastern Shore, with undergraduate programs, as well as doctoral programs in marine, estuarine and environmental sciences.

The county has a 499-acre Enterprise Zone in the City of Crisfield, and a 1,297-acre Zone in the Town of Princess Anne. In addition, Somerset is participating in the One Maryland Program, which offers significant tax credits for capital investments that create jobs. The county's EDC is working on developing services in and around Princess Anne to assist the University of Maryland Eastern Shore and commercial interests in the waterfront of Crisfield.

BUSINESS AND INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY⁵

Princess Anne Industrial Park - Located within the incorporated city limits of the Town of Princess Anne, a 65-acre park divided into lots ranging from approximately three to six acres in size to give the flexibility to meet the varying needs of industry. A 50,000 sq. ft. flex building, which occupies approximately six acres of land is available. The park is conveniently accessible to U.S. Route 13 and to markets north and south and is accessible to rail which runs alongside of the park. Sites are level, cleared and ready for immediate construction. The park is currently being marketed both nationally and internationally.

Crisfield Industrial Park- A 50 acre Industrial park has also been proposed for the City of Crisfield. CDBG funding for infrastructure has been awarded to further pursue this endeavor.

Both Industrial Parks are located within a designated Enterprise Zone, which offers real property tax credits, income tax credits, enhanced job creation tax credits, and priority access to Maryland's financing programs. They are fully equipped with water, sewer, utilities and access roads.

Two Business Parks have been developed which offer both commercial and retail space. These units will be available for sale or lease.
